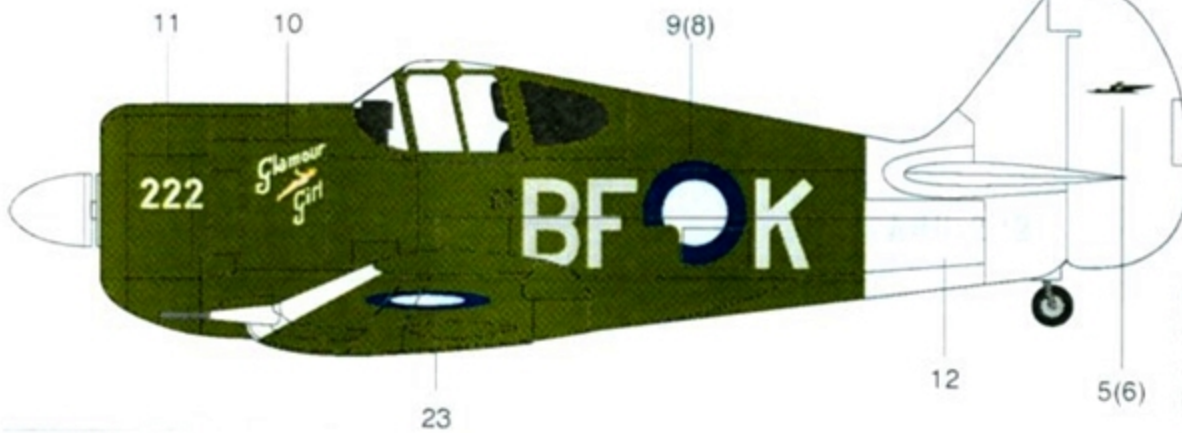
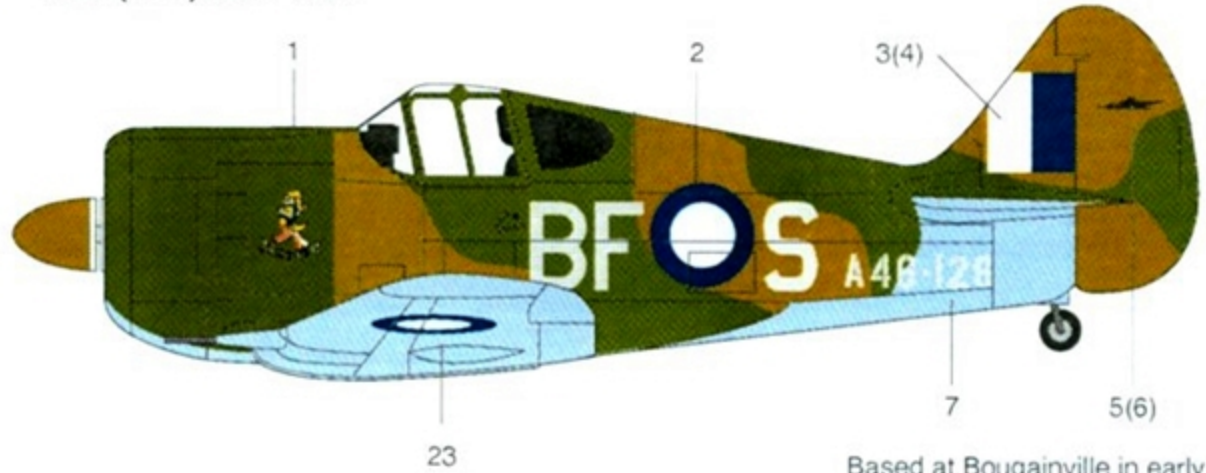

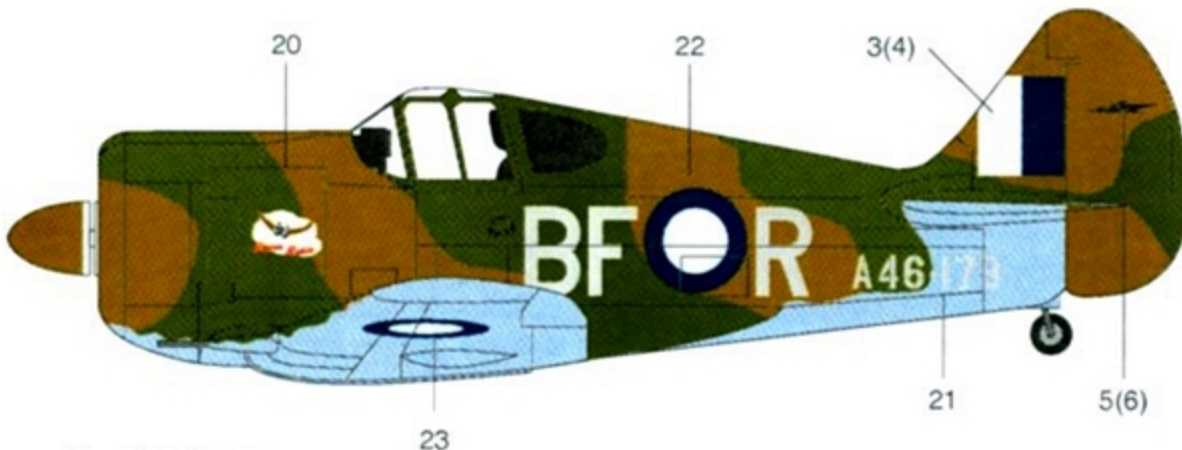
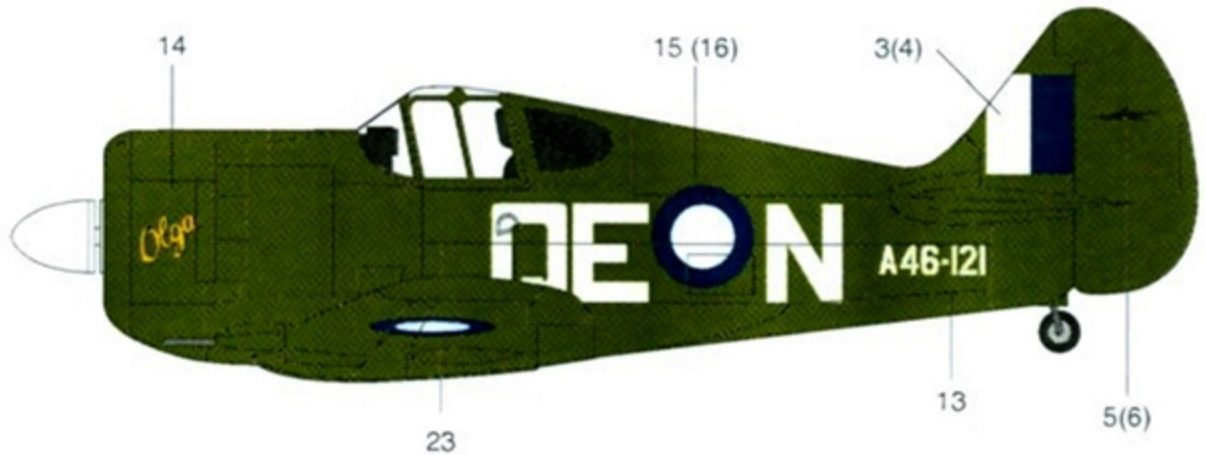

Flt. Lt. Alf Claire's "Sinbad II," CAC Ca-13 Boomerang A46-126, Australia, May, 1945. One of the most photographed of all Boomerangs, the machine wears standard Foliage Green (FS34092) and Earth Brown over Pale Blue. The cowl area appears to wear fresh Foliage Green.



Based at Bougainville in early 1945, Ca-13 A46-222 "Glamour Girl" was piloted by Flt. Lt. I.C. Curtis, No.5 Sqn. The aircraft features overall Foliage Green with white spinner, empenage, and wing leading edges — the scheme typically applied to late-model Boomerangs. Note the partially painted-out fuselage roundel due to repaired damage. On 3/15/45 A/C ran off the landing strip after a recce flight carried out by CO. Sqn Ldr. N. S. Barry. Subsequently the aircraft was scrapped.

By the time Boomerang A46-121 "Olga" was photographed in July, 1945, many CA-13's sported overall Foliage Green — without the characteristic white theater I.D. trim. Note that No.4 Sqn. machines featured the codes "QE" ahead of the starboard-side fuselage roundel.

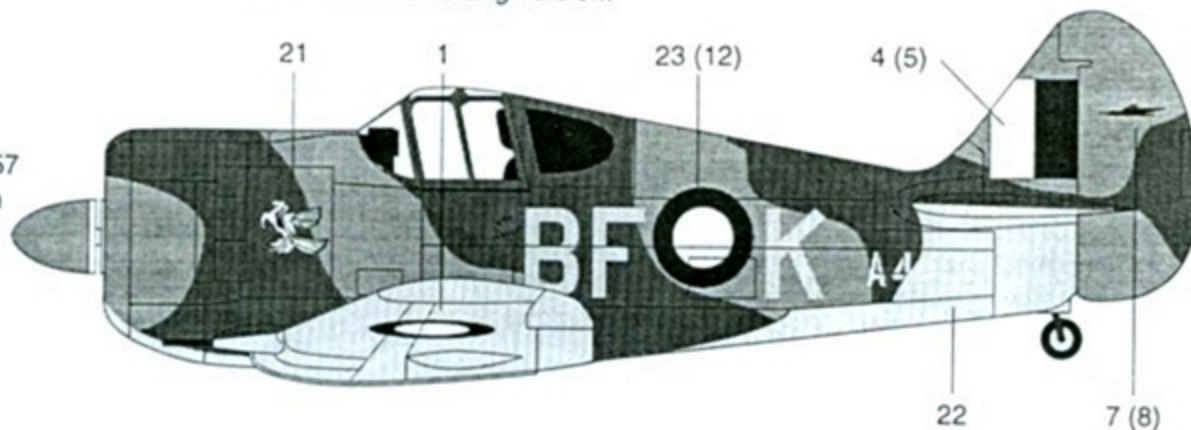


Flown by P.O. Rasmussen of No.5 Sqn., A46-126 "Recce Robin" wears Foliage Green and Earth Brown over Pale Blue. Note the wavy separation line between the upper- and lower-surface camouflage — unusual for CAC Ca-13 Boomerangs.

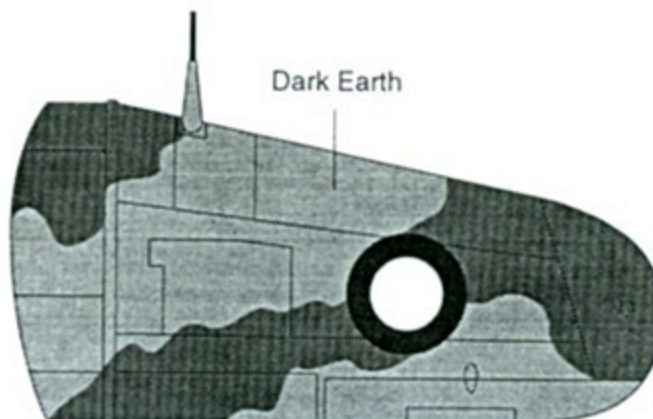
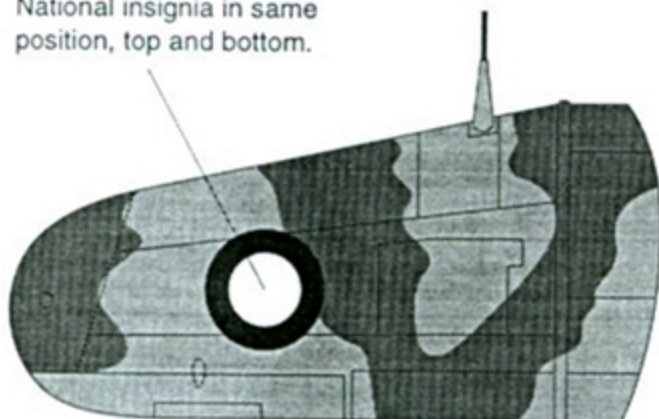

Suggested Kit: LTD's CA-13 Boomerang. By modifying the starboard side exhausts to a simplified, tubular affair, you can produce a CA-12 model. Carefully check your references for other details before modifying the LTD kit to another Boomerang version.

Another "K" of No.5 Sqn., CA-12 A46-57 wears Foliage Green and Earth Brown over Pale Blue. The pattern depicted here was the standard one for CAC Boomerangs.

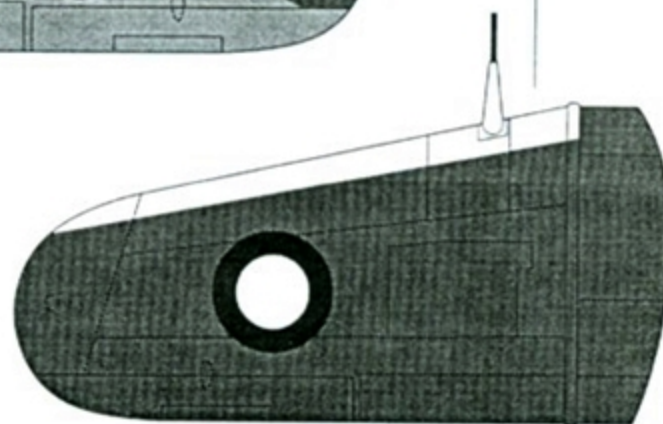
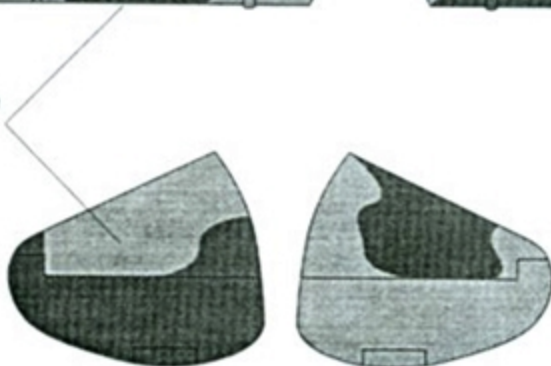


National insignia in same position, top and bottom.
