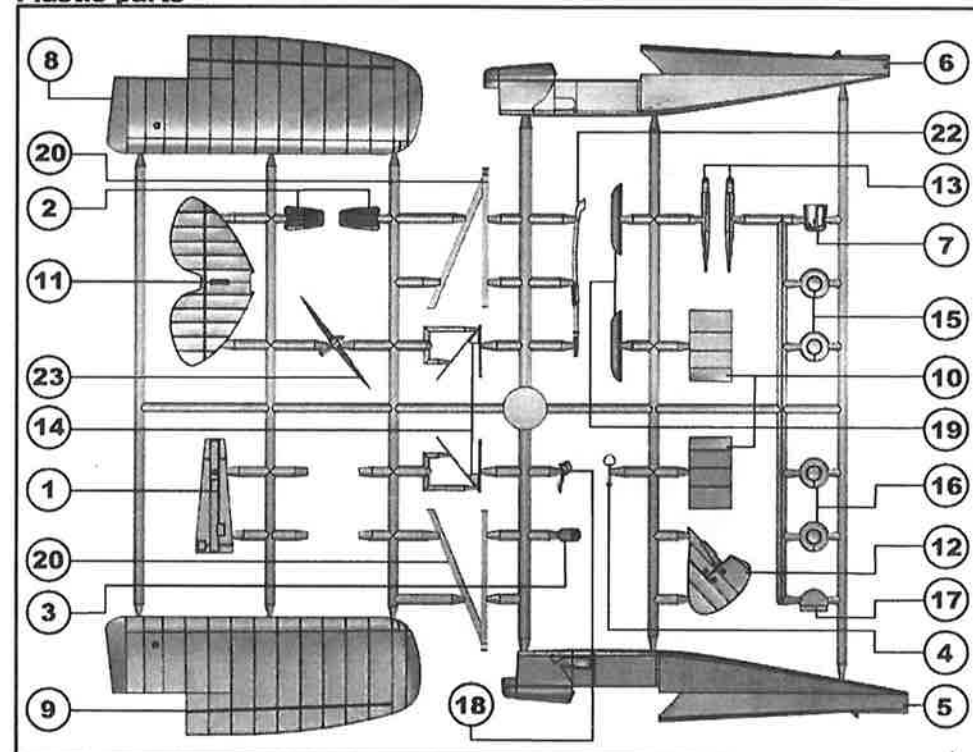

Study drawings and practise assembly before cementing parts together. Paint small parts before assembly. To apply decals cut sheet as required, dip in warm water for a few seconds, slide off backing into position shown. Use in conjunction with box artwork. This model is executed on short run technology and is intended only for experienced modelers. Not appropriate for children under 36 months of age, due to the presence of small detachable parts.

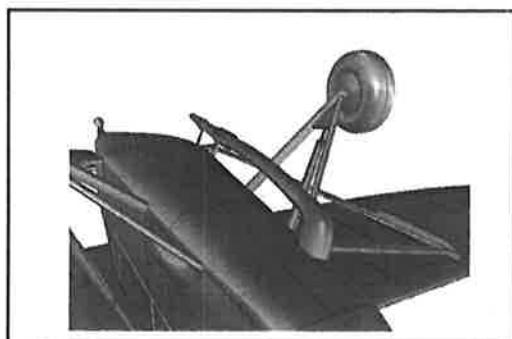
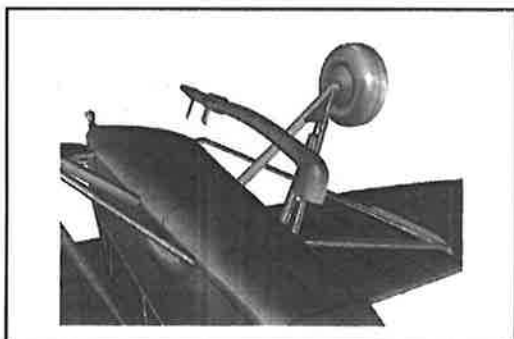
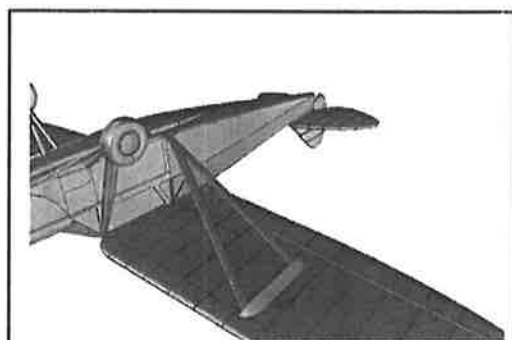
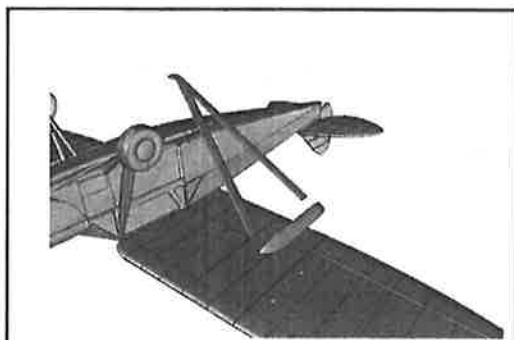
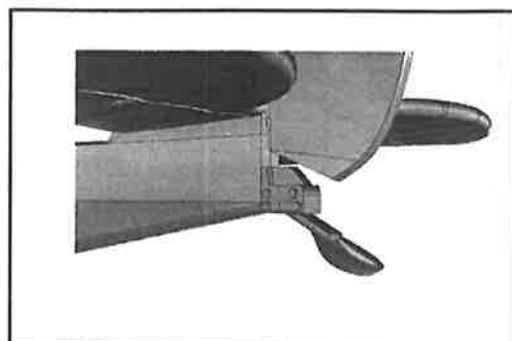
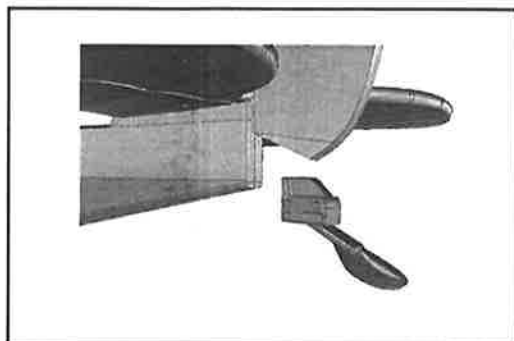
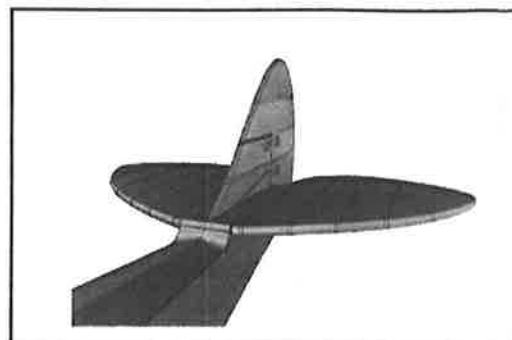
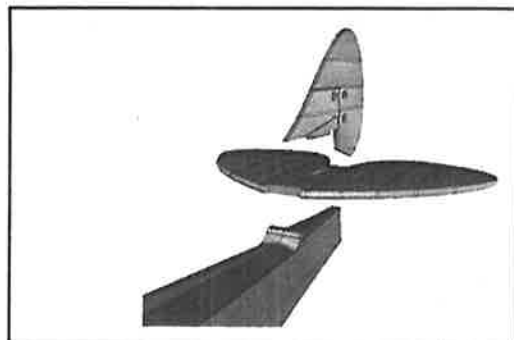

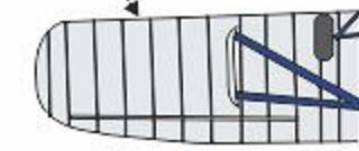
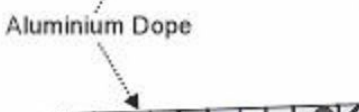




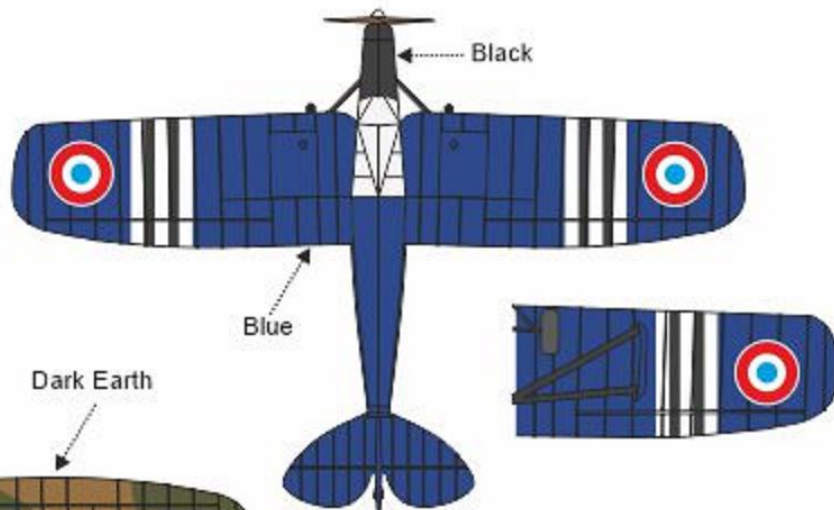
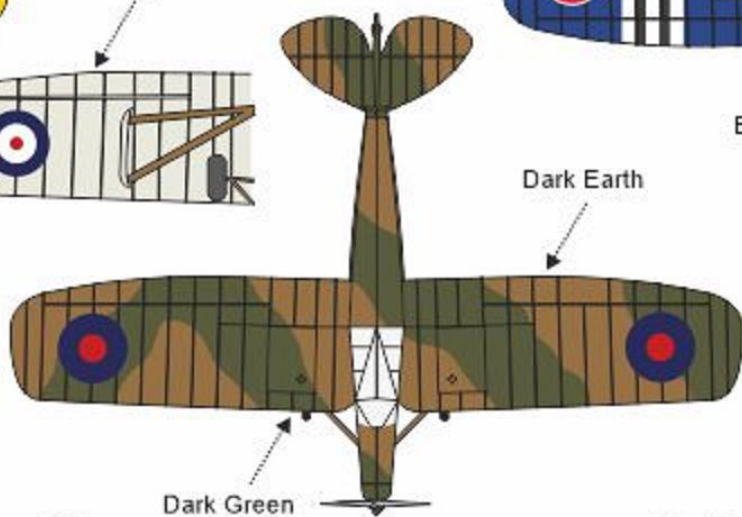
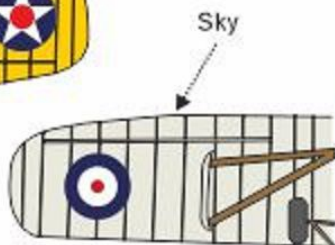
XDH.80A, c/n 2187, US naval serial A8877, purchased for use by US Naval Air Attache, US Embassy in London, 1931-1935.



DH.80A served by Forces Aériennes Françaises Libres (Free French Air Force), Bordeaux, France, late 1944.



DH.80A, c/n 2107, „NZ 582” (previously ZK-ACB) impressed into RNZAF in November 1939, used for communications duties, written off in November 1942, parts used in rebuild of c/n 2204.

DH.80A, c/n 2228, impressed as X5044 in March 1940, used by the Ministry of Supply for Air Transport Auxiliary and the Ferry Pilots' Organizations, England, March 1939 - September 1945.
