

HAWKER HURRICANE IV R.P.

The Hawker Hurricane, the first monoplane fighter to enter service with the R.A.F., shouldered the lion's share of Britain's defence during the "Battle of Britain" and together with the "Spitfire" was responsible for the successful outcome of this conflict.

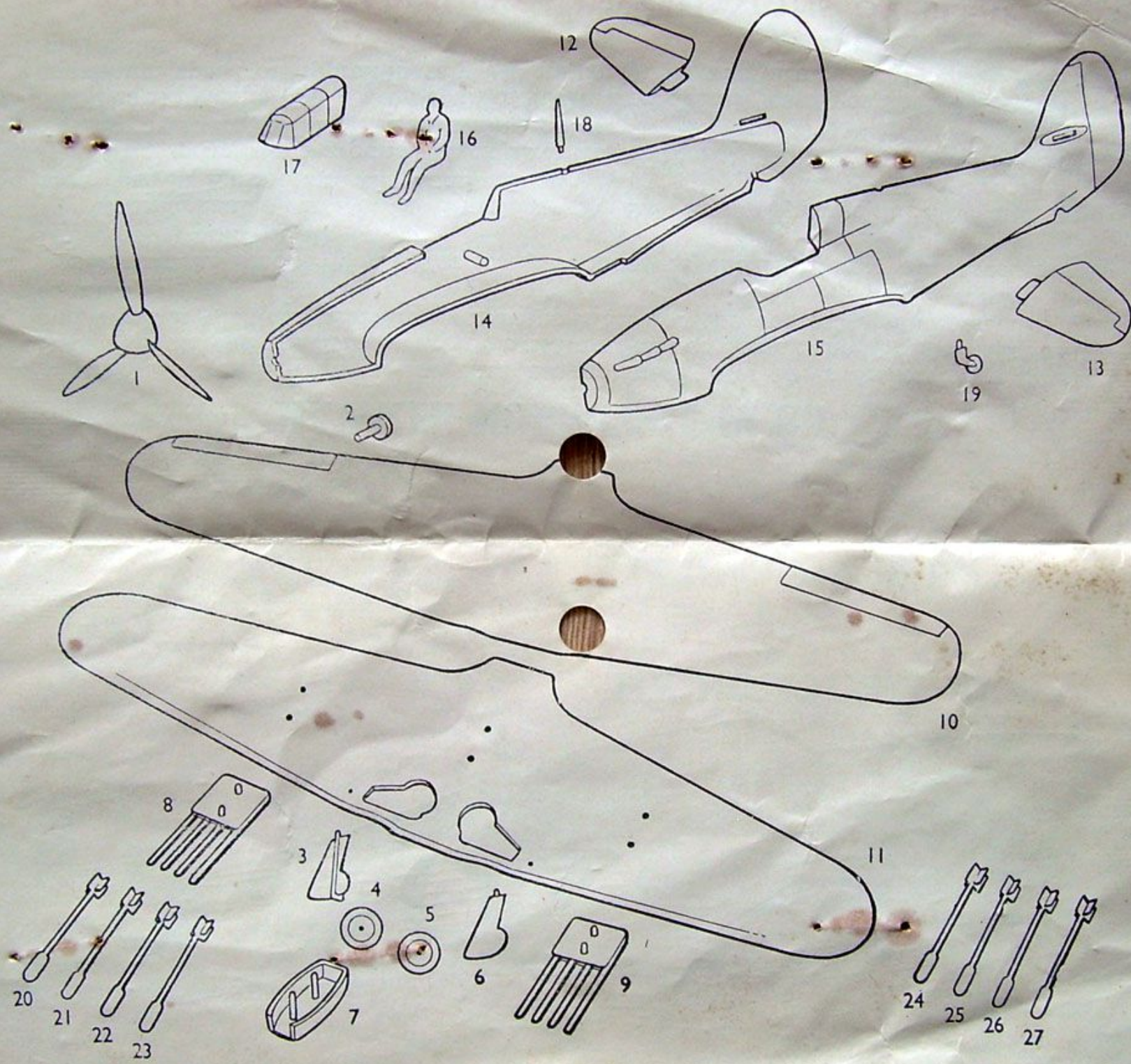
During the Second World War many versions of the Hurricane appeared, some 14,000 being built in all.

This particular version, the Hurricane IV R.P., first appeared in 1943, and was used both in Europe and the Middle East.

It was primarily a ground attack aircraft, its rockets being particularly effective against armoured vehicles, and strong points.

The Hurricane had a wing span of 40 ft., and overall length of 32 ft. 3 ins. and a maximum speed of approximately 340 m.p.h. It was armed with eight rocket projectiles.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cement propeller shaft into propeller and allow to dry (1 and 2).
 2. Position wheels on to axles of undercarriage legs and cement (3, 4, 5 and 6).
 3. Cement undercarriage legs into locations in lower wing by applying cement to inside of wing.
 4. Locate and cement radiator to lower wing (7).
 5. Locate and cement rocket rails to wing (8 and 9).
 6. Cement together upper and lower wing halves and allow to dry (10 and 11).
 7. Locate port and starboard tailplanes on to fuselage halves and cement, applying cement on inside only (12 and 13).
 8. When dry, place propeller shaft in fuselage and cement together both halves, ensuring no cement comes into contact with the propeller shaft (14 and 15).
 9. Cement fuselage to wing.
 10. Cement pilot in position on support provided (16).
 11. Cement cockpit canopy in position, applying cement carefully to the edge of the canopy (17).
 12. Locate and cement radio antenna to fuselage (18).
 13. Cement tailwheel into location provided in fuselage (19).
 14. Carefully cement each rocket in position on its launching rail (20-27).
- NOTE.—IF IT IS WISHED TO PAINT THE MODEL IT SHOULD BE DONE AT THIS STAGE.*
15. *Apply transfers.* First cut the sheet into eleven separate subjects. Then dip each in warm water for a few minutes, slide transfer off backing into position as indicated on illustration. The red and blue roundels are applied above the wing, the red, white and blue beneath the wing. The smaller roundels and their attached squadron marking are applied to the fuselage sides. The aerial number is applied to the rear of the fuselage, and the red, white and blue flashes to the fin, red forward. The aircraft name is applied to the transparent base.
 16. Cement together both parts of stand.
 17. Cement arm of stand into slot provided in fuselage.

SUGGESTED COLOUR SCHEME

DARK GREY. All upper surfaces, fuselage sides.

DARK GREEN. Irregular stripes over dark grey to give camouflaged effect.

LIGHT GREY. All undersurfaces, undercarriage, heads of rockets.

BLACK. Propeller and spinner, exhaust outlets, tyres, rocket rails, bodies of rockets.
