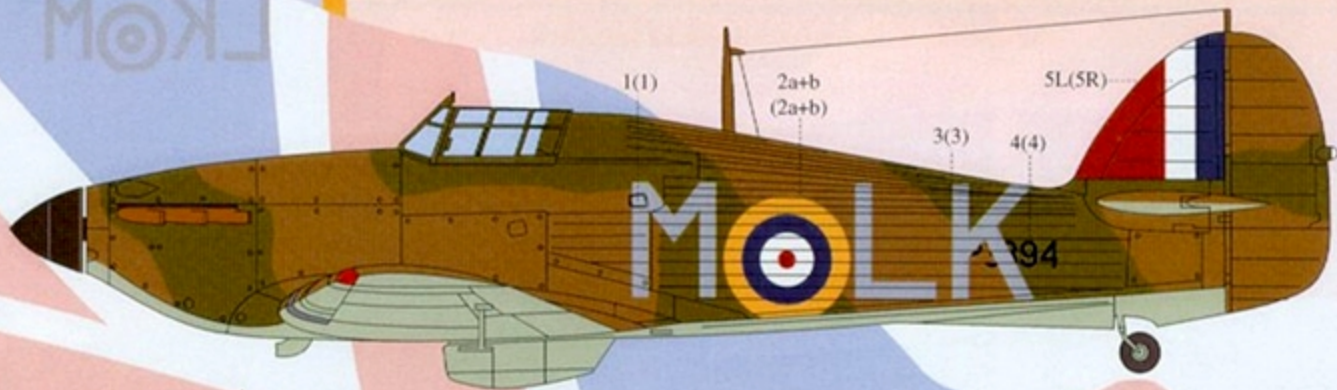

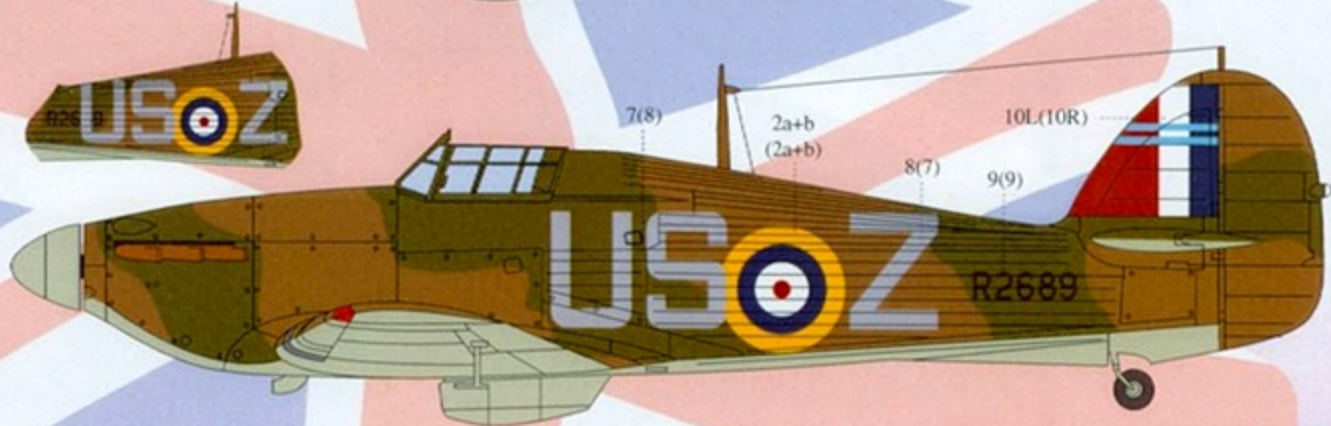

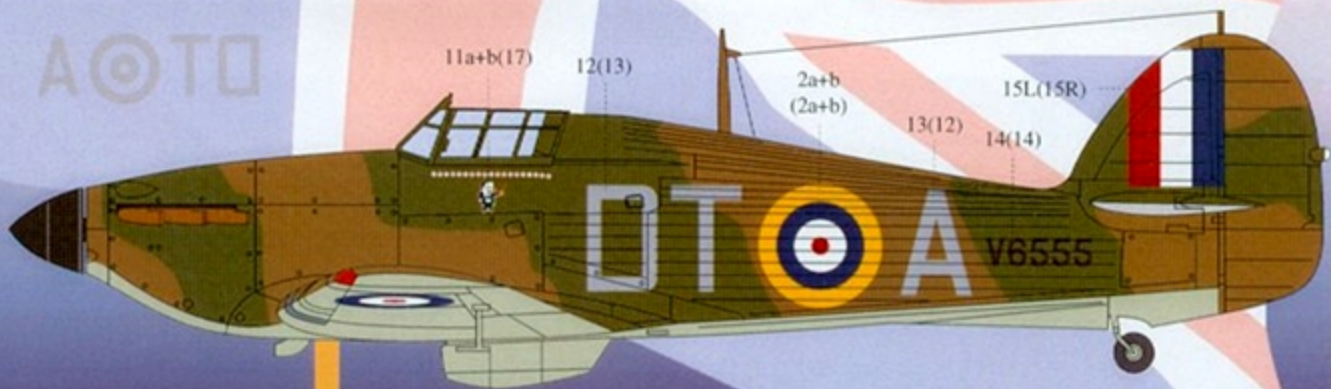
Hurricane Mk.I P3394 M-LK. Pilot Officer J.R. 'Johnny' Cock, Australia. 87 Squadron RAF, Hullavington, 26 July 1940. 'Johnny' Cock used this aircraft for his sixth victory, a night attack against a He 111H-4 laying mines in the Bristol Channel. He gained 6 victories, mainly during the Battle of France. P3394 is also devoid of underwing roundels and carries the B scheme camouflage pattern, as well as all the other A/C on this sheet. De havilland spinner.



Hurricane Mk.I, R2869, US-Z. 56 Sqdn. RAF North Weald, August 1940. Flown by Lt. E. J. Gracie. Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with Sky spinner. No lower wing roundels carried. Squadron code aft of roundel on starboard side. Note that the entire forward portion of the fin is Dull Red. Rotol spinner.



Hurricane Mk. I, "DT-A", V6555, DT-A. 257 Squadron, RAF, North Weald, October 1940. Flown by S/LDR R. S. Tuck, D.S.O., D.F.C., BAR, 29 victories. Dark Earth, Dark Green, and Sky camouflage. Type B camouflage pattern. Black De Havilland spinner. Early A/C, not widely known. Do not confuse with V6864.
