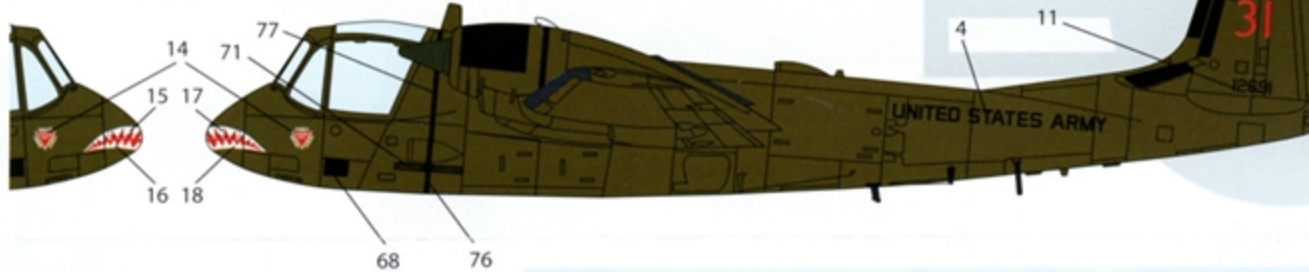

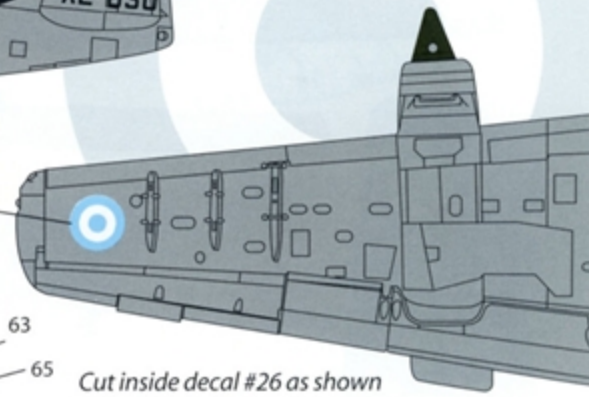

The Argentinian Army accepted 23 Mohawks, since late 1992.

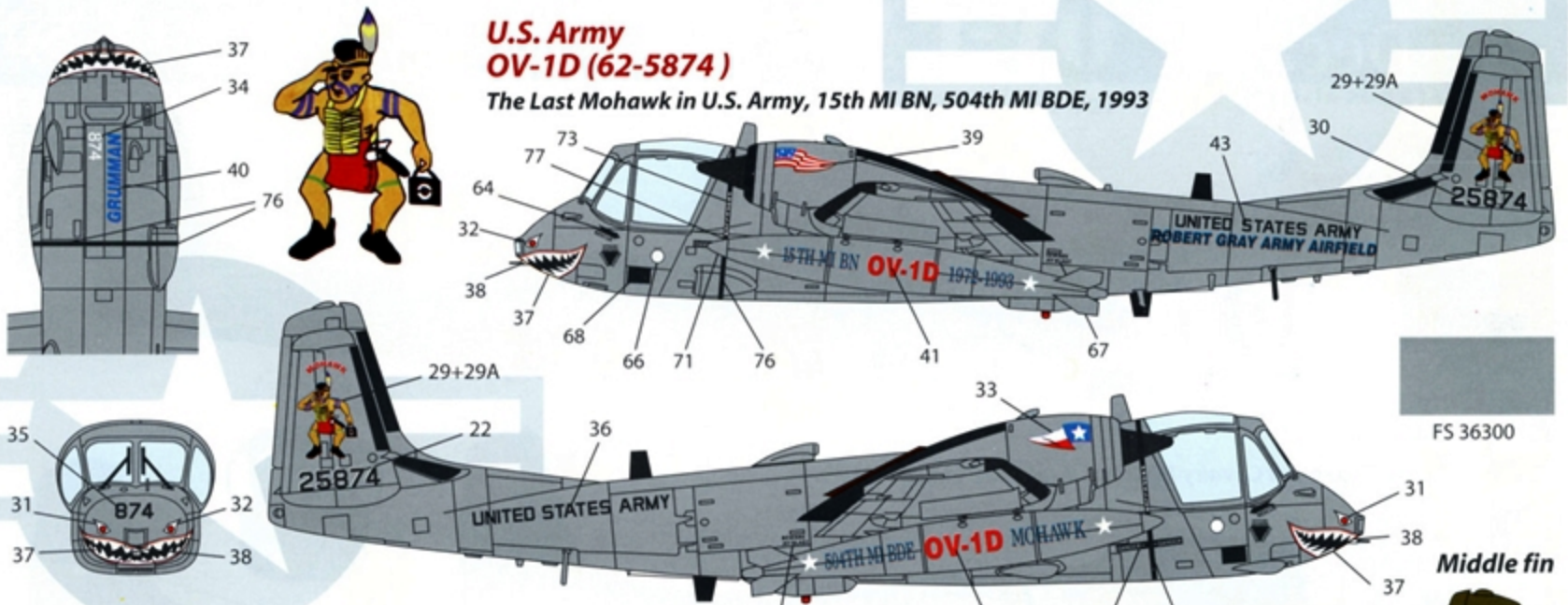


Cut inside decal #26 as shown on the decal and then apply it to the model.

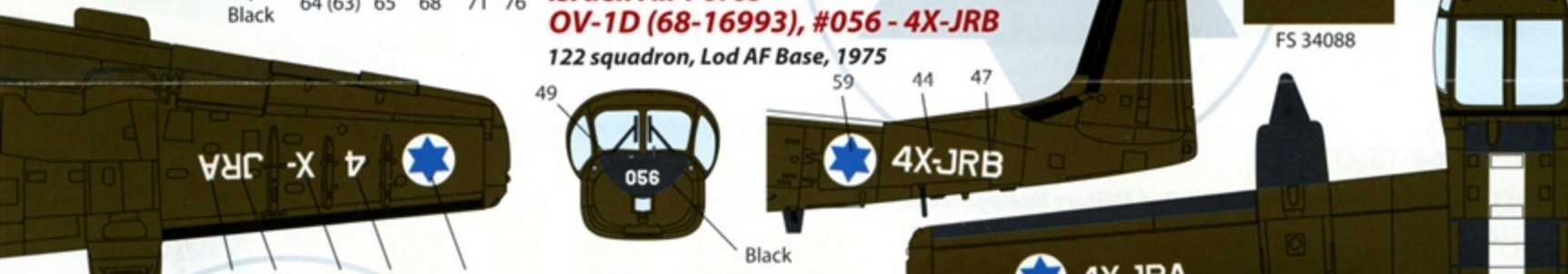
