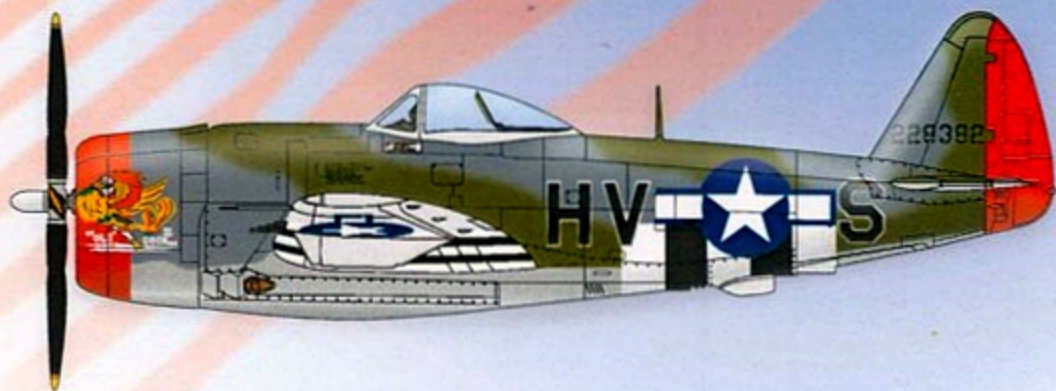
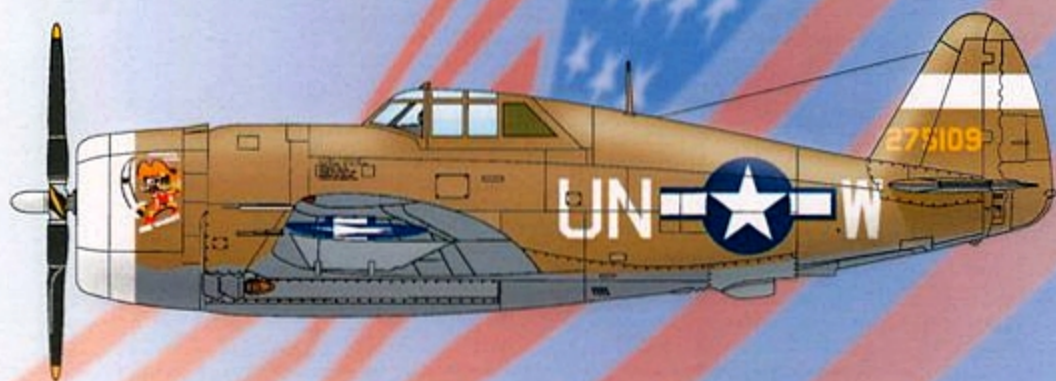
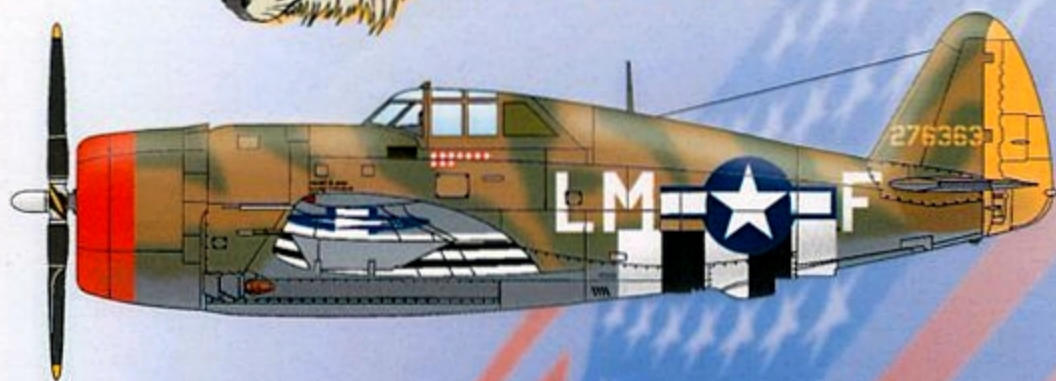
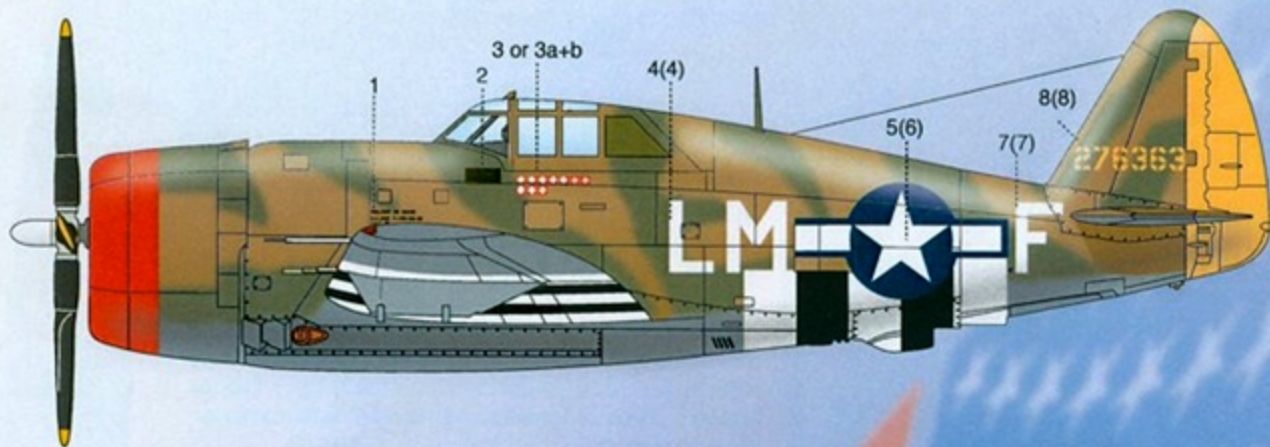

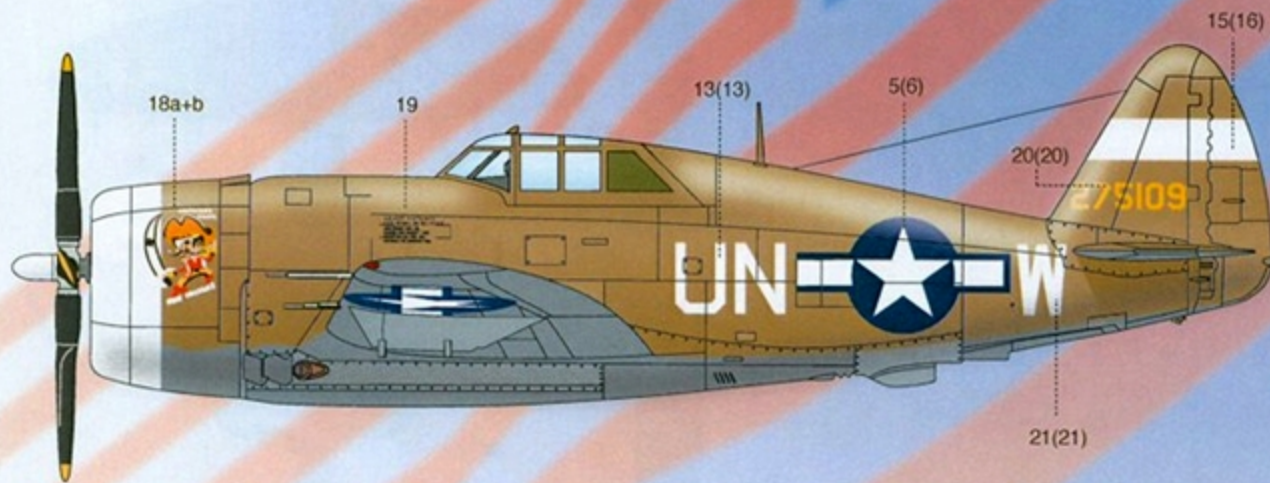
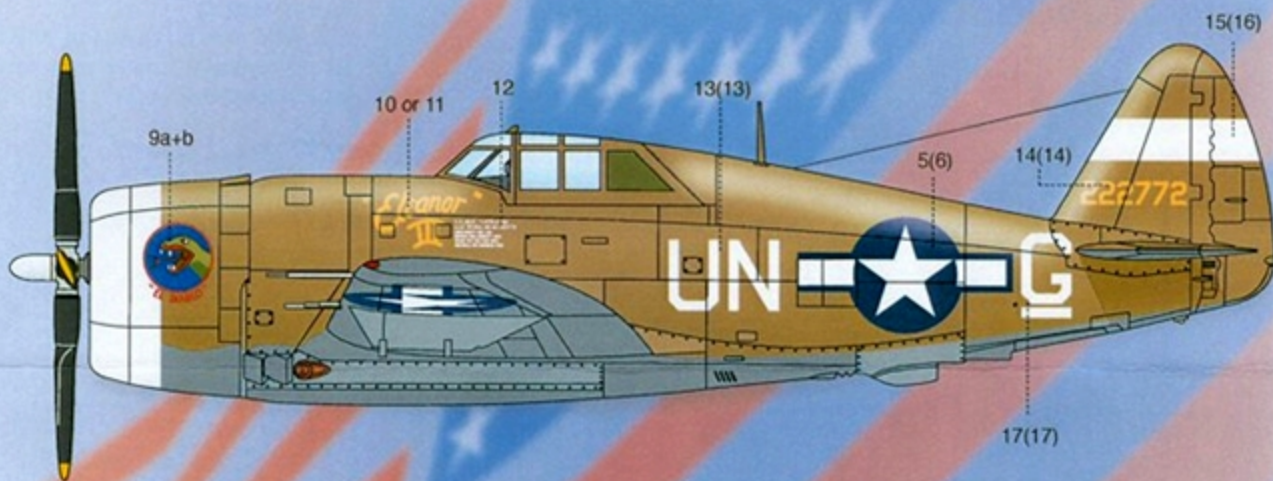


Suggested Kit: Hasegawa/Tamiya P-47 Family.



P-47D, 62FS, flown by Capt. Billy Edens from Boxed in late summer, 1944, wears Olive Drab and Medium Green over Neutral Gray. Dwarf figure on starboard cowl side only. Note the Black/White Normandy invasion stripes beneath the wings and fuselage. Note, too, the standard 24" Red cowl stripe.

"El Diablo/Eleanor III," a P-47D-15-RA (42-22772) of the 63FS flown by Lt. Anthony Cavallo in early 1944, wears Olive Drab over Neutral Gray with the standard 24" White cowl stripe. Note that wing insignia probably appeared in three positions. Sources dispute the color of "Eleanor III," so we have provided an all-White alternative (decal 11). C. E. symmetrical



P-47D-10-RA 42-75107, 63FS, "Louisiana Pirate," flown by 56FG C.O. Maj. Robert Landry and also by John Vogt. Wears Olive Drab over Neutral Gray. Landry scored one kill. Note the standard 24" white cowl stripe. C. E. assymetrical

P-47D-26-RA, 43-28382, "Ole' Cock III", 61st FS, 1945. Flown by Capt. Don Smith. Dark Green and Medium Grey camouflage with Natural Metal lower surfaces and canopy frames. Black/White invasion stripes on lower wings and fuselage. Forward cowling and rudder Red. Notice non standard fuselage insignia. Spoked wheels and no rear view mirrors on this a/c. Left main gear cover is unpainted (Natural Metal). Great side photo on reference 2, page 142.
